At the same time, it provides transparent information on the financial management of the fund and the way in which the funds were used.

The 2024/2025 season has shown that the ACS Foundation can flexibly respond to the needs of people associated with the Spartan community. ACS Foundation provided targeted support to former players and Sparta fans last season, and thanks to its supporters, it continues to provide a reliable background for those who need help.

The ACS Foundation

was established in 2013 with the aim of supporting mainly former players of the club in difficult social or health situations. Over time, its scope has expanded to respond to the needs of the wider Spartan community. Today, the fund offers support not only to former players, but also to fans, families associated with the club, young players, and community projects that have a positive impact on the environment around us. Through the ACS Foundation, the club not only can, but wants to be an active part of the community it co-creates.



CHANGES IN THE FOUNDATION'S BODIES IN THE 2024/2025 SEASON

During the 2024/2025 season, there were no major changes in the mission of the fund, but its bodies were supplemented.

With effect from 1 July 2024, Michal Horňák has become a new member of the Board of Directors.

Jaroslav Bartoň's place on the Supervisory Board was taken over by David Pavelka, who ended his professional career during the season.

STABLE BACKGROUND FOR THE YEARS TO COME

Thanks to the support of fans, club partners, donors, and the Sparta players themselves, the ACS Foundation has a solid financial background and can plan for the long term. In addition, the proceeds from the appreciation of funds and two new partnerships strengthen the stability of the fund and allow the programs to be developed in the coming seasons.

PROGRAMMES AND THEIR IMPACT

ACS Foundation

carries out its activities through four main programs that respond to the most common needs of people associated with the Spartan community. Each program has clearly set rules, target group, and type of support, which makes the help targeted, transparent, and effective.

I. EMERGENCY IMMEDIATE ASSISTANCE PROGRAM

■ WHO IT HELPS:

Persons or families who have found themselves unexpectedly in a difficult life situation — for example, after losing their home, due to a serious illness, an accident to a breadwinner, a sudden loss of income, or the need to provide special medical or support equipment.

■ WHAT THE PROGRAM ENABLES:

- reimbursement of acute costs,
- purchase of medical aids and support equipment,
- co-financing of treatment or rehabilitation,
- helping families with children in a difficult situation,

II. PROGRAMME SUPPORT FOR FORMER AC SPARTA PRAGUE PLAYERS

■ WHO DOES IT HELP:

Former players who represented Sparta in the past and are now facing health, social or financial complications.

■ WHAT THE PROGRAM ENABLES:

- reimbursement of medical and rehabilitation expenses,
- support for long-term health problems,
- purchase of medicines and special aids,
- contribution to spa care.

■ HOW IT WORKS:

Applications are reviewed twice a year. The support is intended not only for members of the Sparta Plejer Club — any former player over the age of 65, or even younger players in serious need, can now apply.

III. YOUNG PLAYERS SUPPORT PROGRAMME

■ WHO DOES IT HELP:

To the families of players from the Spartan youth academy who found themselves in a difficult financial situation.

■ WHAT THE PROGRAM ENABLES:

- payment of membership fees.

■ HOW IT WORKS:

Applications are submitted twice a year. The contribution is always sent directly to the account of the AC Sparta Prague Football Club Association to ensure the effectiveness of the support.



IV. SPARTAN SUPPORT PROGRAM

■ WHO DOES IT HELP:

People with a relationship with Sparta who are actively involved in sports, education, inclusion, healthy lifestyle, or sustainability.

■ WHAT THE PROGRAM ENABLES:

- contributions to sports clubs and leisure activities,
- support for children with health or social disadvantages,
- financing aids for the disabled,
- support for educational, community-based and sustainable projects.

The four pillars of assistance

create a system that can respond to both long-term needs (care for former players) and sudden life situations (emergency assistance), support youth, and the development of community and inclusive projects.

STORIES OF HELP



5.

JULY 2024 SHAKHTAR SOCIAL CAMP

WHO WE SUPPORTED

25 children from the Donetsk region, one of the most conflict-affected regions of Ukraine.

Children grow up in very demanding conditions for a long time, which affects their psychological well-being, development, and access to sports and education. Being in a safe environment allows them to gain new experiences, gain support, and experience childhood outside the weight of everyday reality.

ACS Foundation has once again joined forces with FC Shakhtar Donetsk and together they have prepared a nine-day sports and educational camp in Prague. The children attended daily football training in the area of SK Aritma, trips to Vyšehrad, the center of Prague and Divoká Šárka. The highlight was the participation in a home match of the Champions League, where the children accompanied the players of Sparta and Shamrock to the playing field. The program also included a tour of the stadium with Tomáš Hübschman and training led by first team defender Jan Mejdr.

The ACS Foundation covered the complete costs associated with the organization of the camp, which amounted to **CZK 193,543**.

The children took away not only sports experiences, but also a sense of safety, respect, and belonging. They left Prague with new energy and motivation.



5.

AUGUST 2024 THE STORY OF BERTÍK

■ WHO WE SUPPORTED

The family of little Bertík, who has been facing a difficult life situation for a long time related to caring for a child with a serious illness.

The family needs a stable financial background to provide Bertík with appropriate care, rehabilitation, and support. The health costs are high and require long-term effort.

In the previous season, a charity match took place in Olešník, the proceeds of which were donated to Bertík's support.

At the beginning of the 2024/2025 season, ACS Foundation handed over a total amount of **CZK 601,555** to the family.

The allowance provided the family with important security and peace of mind during the period when they were struggling with financial and psychological burdens. The support contributed to the improvement of the conditions of care for Bertík and enabled the family to better cope with everyday difficult situations.

AUGUST 2024

SMILING CROCODILE – TUITION FEES FOR A CHILD WITH A COMBINED DISABILITY

■ WHO WE SUPPORTED

A family caring for a girl with a combined disability who requires intensive support, specialized therapies, and an individual educational approach.

The girl attends kindergarten and a school that offers, among other things, music therapy, Canis therapy, work with communication technologies, and physiotherapy. These services help children with severe disabilities to better understand the world, communicate better, and cope with everyday situations. Special schools and kindergartens often represent a significant financial burden for families. Individual education, therapy, and special aids are expensive, but essential for the development of the child and ensuring daily care.

The ACS Foundation contributed **CZK 25,000** to cover the tuition fees so that the girl could continue in the program, which fundamentally affects her development and the quality of life of the whole family.



5.

SEPTEMBER 2024 TUTORING CHILDREN IN PRAGUE 7

■ WHO WE SUPPORTED

Pupils from Prague 7 who are preparing for secondary school entrance exams.

Many pupils need individual preparation to have the same chances of success as their peers.

A tutoring program is taking place in Prague 7 to help pupils master the demanding curriculum, fill in the gaps, and strengthen their self-confidence before the entrance exams.

The ACS Foundation supported the program with **CZK 250,000**, thanks to which it was possible to ensure its quality implementation and keep it available to all pupils, regardless of their financial capabilities.

OCTOBER 2024 FLOODS IN THE JESENÍK AND KRNOV REGIONS

WHO WE SUPPORTED

Families, local businesses, sports clubs, and entire communities were affected by the devastating floods in the regions of Jeseník and Krnov.

The area was hit by widespread flooding in the fall of 2024, which damaged households, property, and local infrastructure. Many residents have lost basic equipment and the ability to function normally.

The ACS Foundation has been actively involved in the renewal of the region through a combination of **financial and material assistance**. The support was directed to:

- for the renewal of local businesses: ASPEC bakery in Krnov – financial donation of CZK 500,000,
- SK Zátor football club – material assistance (jerseys, balls) in the amount of CZK 84,000 and a financial donation in the amount of CZK 16,000,
- to the football club SK Řetězárna Česká Ves – a financial donation of CZK 100,000,
- households through the purchase of direct heaters, dryers, refrigerators, cookers or washing machines in cooperation with the Police of the Czech Republic – material assistance worth CZK 355,636,
- professional football club SFC Opava – equipment for the renovation of facilities worth CZK 63,305.

A total of **CZK 1,118,941** was allocated for assistance, which helped restore basic living conditions and sports infrastructure in the region.

Thanks to quick assistance, people in the affected areas were able to start rebuilding their homes and community life. In addition, the support of the clubs contributed to the return of children to sports, which were temporarily impossible after the floods.



5.

DECEMBER 2024 SUPPORT FOR A CHILD WITH A RARE GENETIC DISEASE

■ WHO WE SUPPORTED

A family caring for a child who suffers from a very rare genetic disease requiring continuous care, intensive therapy, and financially demanding aids.

Extensive care is a strong psychological and economic burden for the family. The costs of rehabilitation, therapy, and special equipment often exceed the possibilities of the normal family budget.

The family turned to the ACS Foundation for support of expensive therapies, which are key to ensuring at least partial improvement in the child's health and maintaining the quality of daily care.

The ACS Foundation provided the family with a contribution of **CZK 120,000**, which was intended for specialized therapies and equipment facilitating daily care.

APRIL 2025

SUPPORT FOR SPORT IN AFRICA – EQUIPMENT FOR CSPRO ACADEMY

■ WHO WE SUPPORTED

Young players at the CSPRO Academy in Zimbabwe, which is led by former Spartan Costa Nhamoinesu.

In many African regions, children have a great desire to play sports, but they lack safe conditions, quality equipment, and sometimes even basic sports equipment. Handing over Spartan equipment has a significant impact — children get not only jerseys, but also motivation, inspiration, and a sense that their talent has value. AC Sparta Prague (hereinafter referred to as the Club) has collected equipment that it would no longer use in Prague — jerseys and training kits.

ACS Foundation covered all costs of transporting the equipment to Africa in the amount of **CZK 146,821**.

The equipment has been given a second life and has found meaningful use in the academy, which helps children grow not only as athletes but also as personalities. The project combined sport, sustainability, and human solidarity.



5.

MAY 2025

ADJUSTABLE BED FOR BOYS WITH MUSCULAR DYSTROPHY

WHO WE SUPPORTED

A family caring for a boy with muscular dystrophy — a progressive disease that gradually limits motor skills and increases the demands on care.

For people with this type of disease, an adjustable bed is essential for proper breathing, comfort, and prevention of pain and complications. Without this aid, care is significantly more physically and health-intensive.

The family asked for a contribution to purchase a specialized adjustable bed, which allows the child to be positioned safely and facilitates daily care.

The ACS Foundation contributed **CZK 44,400** to the purchase of a bed that improves the comfort of the child and the physical strain on the family.

The new bed significantly improved the child's quality of life and provided the family with relief in daily care. This help has an immediate and long-term effect.

SUPPORT FOR FORMER AC SPARTA PRAGUE PLAYERS

The ACS Foundation distributed **CZK 537,600** to former players in need, which helped to solve acute and long-term health situations.

SUPPORT FOR YOUNG PLAYERS OF AC SPARTA PRAGUE

In the first year of the program's operation, ACS Foundation helped the families of young players with **CZK 42,500**, thus enabling children who would otherwise not be able to afford it to continue their sports training.

FINANCIAL OVERVIEW

Financial stability

is one of the key prerequisites for the long-term operation of the ACS Foundation. In the 2024/2025 season, it was not only possible to cover all approved aid programs, but also to maintain a high level of efficiency and transparency in the use of funds. Thanks to donors, partners, players, and revenues from financial appreciation, the fund continues to have a stable background for the implementation of its activities.

FUND REVENUE

In the 2024/2025 season, the income of the ACS Foundation was made up of regular contributions, financial donations, fundraising activities, and revenues from the appreciation of free funds.

REGULAR CONTRIBUTIONS, FUNDRAISING, AND DONATIONS

In the 2024/2025 season, the ACS Foundation received a total of **CZK 3,657,479** from donations, fundraising activities, and regular contributions.

EVALUATION OF FREE FUNDS

The ACS Foundation has long been striving to ensure that free funds do not lose their value. The Board of Directors has therefore chosen conservative and safe forms of valuation.

REVENUES FROM ADVERTISING AND OTHER COLLABORATIONS

This item includes funds obtained on the basis of advertising or marketing cooperation agreements, especially in connection with the ACS Foundation Tournament, where the participating companies paid for their participation in the form of a marketing partnership. **This activity brought in 150,000 K.**

6.

FUND EXPENDITURE

As part of all programs and individual forms of assistance, the ACS Foundation spent **CZK 3,080,360** in the season, of which:

- **CZK 2,237,055** were financial donations,
- **CZK 843,305** was the value of material assistance and services provided.

These funds were used for:

- support for former players in difficult situations,
- immediate assistance to families and individuals,
- help during floods in the Jeseník and Krnov regions,
- support for youth and families in the academy,
- therapeutic, therapeutic, and medical needs,
- community and educational projects.

COSTS OF MANAGING THE FUND

As every year, administrative costs remained minimal thanks to the support of the Club. The costs for the 2024/2025 season thus amounted to a total of **CZK 12,959**.

What they include:

- Administrative fees
- Bank fees
- External payroll processing for a single job held on a work contract (translator) that provided interpreting for young Ukrainian footballers at the Shakhtar Social Camp
- Costs of organizing a supporters' tournament

This amount is significantly below the limit set by the fund's statute [35% of the fund's assets as of 30.6.2025].

Financial position as at 30/06/2025

- The ACS Foundation has **more than CZK 9 million** at its disposal.

FUNDRAISING AND COMMUNITY ENGAGEMENT



Fundraising

is an essential part of the functioning of the ACS Foundation. In the 2024/2025 season, a wide community of donors — individuals, companies, fans, and Sparta players — has been involved in supporting the fund. Thanks to their support, the fund was able to provide effective assistance to those in need. Below is an overview of the main fundraising activities during the season.

SEPTEMBER 2024 – APRIL 2025 ACS FOUNDATION TOURNAMENT

The traditional football tournament of partner companies took place in the Spartan training center in Strahov. Eight teams of companies that have been supporting Sparta projects for a long time participated.

The highlight was a friendly match between the participants and **the Old Guard of Sparta**, in whose jersey Jan Koller, Vratislav Lokvenc, Martin Frýdek, and Jaroslav Blažek played.

The proceeds of the tournament amounted to CZK 150,000.



7.

NOVEMBER 2024 ANNIVERSARY JERSEY AUCTION

As part of the celebration of the club's 131st anniversary, an auction of special black jerseys with a white „S” took place, inspired by the first preserved historical photograph of the AC Sparta Prague team from 1896. The auction included the played signed jerseys of the players from the league match against Teplice.

The auction on the Dobrobot platform brought **CZK 254,006** in gross proceeds; the net proceeds in favor of ACS Foundation were **CZK 241,306** after deducting the commission.

RETURNABLE CUPS

Sparta fans can throw the backed-up cups into the collection boxes at the stadium during home matches. In the 2024/2025 season, thanks to their support, it was possible to collect **CZK 604,150**, which corresponds to more than 11,800 cups.



7.

SEPTEMBER 2024 EPET CHALLENGE FOR ACS AND EPET EMPLOYEES

The main partner of the Club and the AC Sparta Prague stadium repeated the sports challenge for the employees of its company and Sparta, which took place in the last week of June 2024, i.e., the last week of the previous season.

For each kilometer run or walk, epet donated a contribution to the fund's account.

The total amount was **CZK 40,000** and was transferred to the account of the ACS Foundation in September 2024.



T-MOBILE MATCH OF DREAMS COME TRUE

The T-Mobile Match of Dream Come True has become a popular tradition that allows fans to experience what it's like to be a professional player.

In December 2024, the proceeds from the previous year were transferred to the account of the ACS Foundation: **CZK 400,000**.

In June 2025, another edition of this popular match took place. Fans auctioned off a place in the team of Ondra Švejdík and Roman Bednář in a charity auction and could play on the Letná lawn alongside Spartan legends.

The total proceeds of the auction of places in the team of Ondra Švejdík and Roman Bednář amounted to **CZK 553,000** [the proceeds will be credited to the account of the ACS Foundation in the next monitored period].

7.

REGULAR CONTRIBUTION BY SPARTA PLAYERS

Players of the A and B teams with a professional contract contribute to the fund's activities every month for a long time. In the 2024/2025 season, they donated a total of **CZK 876,137**.

Their regular contribution is proof that belonging and helping those in need are an integral part of the club's culture.

LONG-TERM PARTNERS

In February 2025, the ACS Foundation also established cooperation with **CIRCONOM Wood Plastic a.s.**, a **Made in PUBLICITY s.r.o.**, which undertook to contribute regularly every month to the activities of the fund; for the months falling into the 2024/2025 season, their support amounted to a total of **CZK 25,000** from **CIRCONOM Wood Plastic a.s.**, and **CZK 30 000** from **Made in PUBLICITY s.r.o.**



DONATIONS AND CONTRIBUTIONS RECEIVED

In the year under review, the ACS Foundation received a total of **CZK 3,657,479** for its activities.
